That was the case at the very recent championship tourney just west of Philadelphia. A rumored 23 country/field clubs were involved, and up to 68 courts were in play to host both the men's and women's brackets. The event featured a total of 128 teams for the men and 96 for the women.

It's great to see the top players in the game, and especially this year, as the Field Club had two local members participating

at a very high level. Jeff Morneau and his partner, Juan Arraya, entered as the 3rd seed, and John Hughes and his partner, Marc Powers, were there as the 4th seed. That's 3rd and 4th in the nation! Pretty impressive!

This tournament is like no other. You have every top player in the country competing all around you. Johan, he's the guy with the best forehand in the game. Jared, he won Wimbledon back in the
