A week after edging the number one ranked team and defending champions, Juan Arraya and Jeff Morneau, in the semifinals of The Duane Hayden Long Island Invitational, the third-ranked team of John Hughes and Marc Powers posted a similar result in the Western New England Championships in Longmeadow, MA. The 6-2, 6-2 score in the final was in marked contrast to the usual three-set scores experienced in virtually all of the combatants' recent matches. Tournament Director Morneau, when asked for the turning point in the match, pointed to "when we lost the first game," but did not otherwise make excuses for the result.

The tournament field of 26 teams had to endure day-long, white-out conditions as western New England welcomed the season's first snow storm, dumping 6 inches of snow. The snowfall made for a festive atmosphere for the steady stream of spectators who attended the event and enjoyed viewing a high level of platform performed in difficult conditions, just another reminder of the uniqueness of this great outdoor sport.
